30. RECEIVE report of the Executive Officer.
  
31. RECEIVE AND FILE the ordinance establishing procedures for **processing construction change orders** at the May Board meeting and adopt it at the next meeting.
  
32. AUTHORIZE:
  - A. the finding that award of **design-build contracts pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 130242(a)** will achieve for the MTA certain private sector efficiencies in the integration of the design, project work and components related to the real property renovation, repair and construction work for MTA trackwork, facilities and systems modifications in Los Angeles County; and
  - B. the Chief Executive Officer to solicit and award design-build contracts for the modification and construction of the tail track at Union Station and storage tracks at the Midway Yard to accommodate the Eastside project.

(REQUIRES A 2/3 VOTE OF THE BOARD)

33. AUTHORIZE the Chief Executive Officer to execute **Change Order No. 61 to Contract No. H1100, Automatic Train Control**, with Union Switch and Signal, Inc. on the Metro Green Line for a credit in the amount of not less than \$395,000 for the deletion of Driverless Demonstration Test, decreasing the total contract value from \$62,785,743 to \$62,390,743.

COMMITTEE AUTHORITY, 4/5 vote.
