

Louis F. Moret

Dr. Lou Moret brings over 30 years experience in politics, administration and finance and is a highly respected community leader. He has a vast professional background, as well as a diverse record of service on boards of for-profit and non-profit organizations.

Dr. Moret served on the \$300 Billion CalPERS Board of Administration, and has successfully completed the Directors Education and Certification Program at U.C.L.A. Prior to joining CalPERS, he was the longest serving appointed member in the history of the Los Angeles Fire and Police Pension Board, where he gained a wealth of knowledge in the areas of finance and investment. Dr. Moret was first appointed to the board in 1991 by Mayor Tom Bradley, and has since served three other mayors. He also served as Co Chair of the Audit and Accounting Committee of ICGN. Dr. Moret has gained the respect of his peers as well as members of the pension community for his commitment to the fiduciary responsibilities of the board, his integrity and accountability.

Dr. Moret has also served on numerous for profit and non-profit boards including: The East Los Angeles Community Union, JT 2 Corporation, a third-party workers compensation service provider; Santa Barbara Group of Mutual Funds, Diamond Contract Services Inc., Lasair Capital, Intercontinental Realty Advisory Board, American Residential Partners Advisory Board, KB Home National Advisory Council, Global LT and the Huff Hispanic Holdings Fund.

Dr. Moret was an Adjunct Professor of the Graduate School of Public Policy at Pepperdine University. Long active in political and community affairs, Dr. Moret was a member of the Democratic National Committee from 1981-1993, and served as Chair of the Hispanic Caucus from 1982-84. He was also a founding board member of the National Association of Latino Elected Officials (NALEO), and served on the board of directors of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute from 1985-1990. He was a delegate to every Democratic Convention from 1984-2000.

For more than 15 years, Dr. Moret served as Chief Operating Officer at the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), the largest regional planning organization in the United States. Prior to joining SCAG, he was Vice President of Cranston Securities Company, where he specialized in public finance and interacted extensively with finance directors, city managers, and other officials in state and local government. In 1979, he was appointed by President Jimmy Carter and confirmed by the United States Senate to serve as the first Director of the Office of Minority Economic Impact in the Department of Energy. He also served as Commissioner of the Los Angeles Department of Public Works, Chief of staff for Assemblyman Richard Alatorre and Deputy Director for the United States Office of Minority Business Enterprise.

He earned his Doctor of Public Administration (DPA) from the University of La Verne, his Masters in Public Administration from the University of Southern California (MPA), and his Bachelor of Arts in Sociology from Whittier College. He is also a recipient of a Professional Designation for Senior Managers in Government from Harvard University.

Dr. Moret is a licensed Professional Boxing Referee and has officiated in over 200 World Championship Fights. He was inducted into the California Boxing Hall of Fame in 2014. He is an avid wine collector and is a member of the Chevaliers du Tastevin and Commandarie de Bordeaux, and is also a member of the California Club. Dr. Moret has five grown children and resides in Los Angeles with his wife.
