## How Full Is My Train?

Metrolink recently introduced an online tool called How Full Is My Train? It allows riders to check the recent typical ridership of their train so they can be assured there's plenty of room for social distancing. The agency is also monitoring ridership so it can add train cars or trains as they reach capacity levels of 30% or more.

In a recent survey of riders, Metrolink found that **hand sanitizers on trains** was the most requested amenity. As a result, Metrolink has more than doubled hand sanitizing stations on board every train car.

Look for them located next to each passenger door when you board and exit the train. Dispensers are being refilled frequently throughout the day.



## Bike Share Discount

Metro Bike Share is offering a discount for August—the fare will be \$1 for a 30-minute ride (vs. \$1.75) and a 24-Hour Access Pass (vs. \$5).
