Subject: Alternate Bicycle and/or Pedestrian Coordinators for Metro's Streets and Freeways Subcommittee

Metro is seeking applications for alternate members for the Metro Streets and Freeways (S&F) Subcommittee Bicycle and Pedestrian coordinators (one for Bicycle and one for Pedestrian). Once alternate members are confirmed, they along with the primary members would be considered for membership to the Metro Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

The S&F Subcommittee is a technical subcommittee of Metro's TAC and meets on the third Thursday of each month at the Metro headquarter building. Members provide assistance to Metro by reviewing and evaluating various transportation policies and issues in Los Angeles County including: Call for Projects; Funding issues such as Obligation Authority, STP-L, etc.; New State and Federal requirements; Caltrans Local Assistance Guidelines; Traffic signal information sharing such as Arterial ITS and RIITS; Bicycle and Pedestrian Policies and Issues; System Preservation; Congestion Pricing; Goods Movements; SAFE; and General Streets/Freeways/Soundwall Policy Issues.

At the July 18th meeting, the Subcommittee approved the following solicitation: "Metro S&F Subcommittee is soliciting nominations for alternates for existing S&F Subcommittee members representing Bicycle and Pedestrian issues. The candidates must be a full-time local jurisdiction or public transportation agency employee whose primary responsibilities are working on bicycle and/or pedestrian transportation projects, programs and/or policies. Consultants and those holding contracts with Metro, and/or those who bid on Metro solicitations pertaining to matters that TAC and its Subcommittees discuss and make recommendations, and/or those that have financial interest in the recommendations of TAC and its Subcommittees, are not eligible. The members' responsibilities with their local jurisdiction or transportation agency must be primarily focused on bicycle and/or pedestrian technical issues including policy development and project implementation to promote sustainable healthy living and active transportation. The ideal candidates must have working knowledge and experience working with the bicycle or pedestrian communities."
