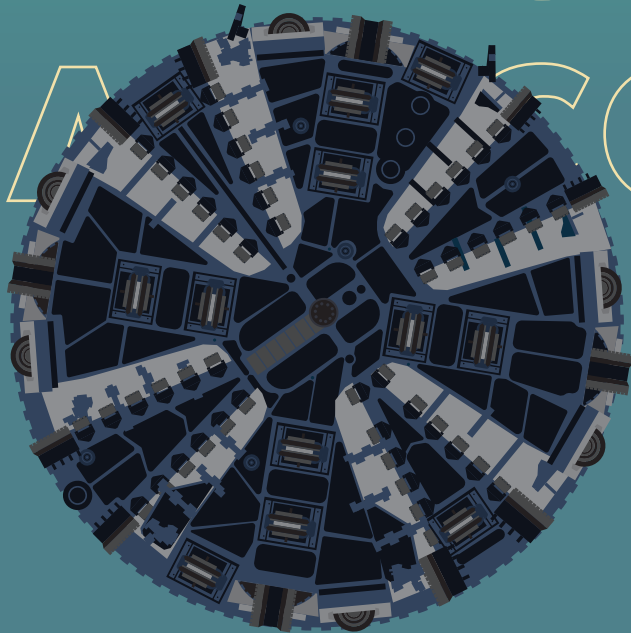

WHAT WILL THE TBMS DO?


The TBMs will be digging two parallel tunnels for the Purple Line Extension subway so that trains can travel between Beverly Hills and Century City.

HOW TO ENTER

- > Create one piece of artwork that shows what your ideal community looks like. Be sure to include the Purple Line Extension Transit Project.
- > The winner will receive recognition at the Purple Line Extension Section 2 Tunnel Boring Machine Unveiling Ceremony, a commemorative Metro TAP card with their artwork and additional prizes!
- > The artwork you submit can be a painting, drawing or a collage.
- > Your entry must be no larger than 8.5" x 11" and lay flat.
- > You must be a student in Kindergarten through 5th grade to enter.
- > Submit your entry by March 15, 2019.
- > Only LA County students are eligible.
- > **Please submit your entry online via metro.net/purple.**
- > The winning art work will appear on the TBMs and commemorative Metro TAP cards.
- > The winning artwork will be chosen by a panel of judges and LA County voters. Polls will open on March 25, 2019, and will close April 30, 2019.

- > Please keep the original copy of your artwork until the voting period is over (April 30, 2019). Winners must submit their original artwork to Metro via postal mail for reproduction.
